



Use of Title and Designation - "Social Worker," "RSW"

Practicing Social Workers registered with the College are <u>legally entitled and professionally</u> <u>obligated</u> to use the title and designation of "Social Worker, RSW" in their correspondence and/or communication to ensure that the public is aware that they are regulated professionals. In accordance with *The Social Work Profession Act*, this legal entitlement applies to all Registered Social Workers regardless of their place of employment or position title.

The Social Work Profession Regulation 21(1) clarifies the legal requirements regarding use of title by Social Workers.

A practicing member <u>must include</u> in their professional signature:

- a. Highest post-secondary academic credential (i.e. MSW)
- b. Professional designation (RSW)
- c. Position title

Requirements regarding disclosure of academic credentials, professional designation and title are set out in legislation, which supersedes any conflicting employer policies or practices.

Restrictions on the use of title, "Social Worker", and designation, "RSW", apply to *unregistered practitioners* who, by law, are not authorized to use the title Social Worker or represent themselves as Social Workers in Manitoba.

Employers are invited to contact and partner with the College when communicating information regarding the Social Work Profession Act to their employees.
